COSMIC AMERICAN BLUES

With two dogs, an eight-track recorder and a book of old murder ballads, twin brothers Rich and Rob Kwait would start their musical journey. Visiting mountain cabins (from Vermont to Tennessee) and listening to the country blues, the Philadelphia-based brothers would write two albums of original American songs and perform them with a full band under the name *Kwait Brothers Band*. Six years after embarking on the journey, the brothers and the band would retreat to the mountains of New York State (a hiker's town called Phoenicia) and start a new chapter and a new album under the name...**CABIN DOGS**.

Recorded and mixed in a yellow farmhouse at the foot of Hurley Mountain (near Woodstock, NY), with co-production and keys/accordion by Aaron "Professor Louie" Hurwitz (the Band, Mercury Rev, Graham Parker), the new album, *Electric Cabin*, marks the fruition of the brothers' journey and the **CABIN DOGS'** first foray onto the national scene.
